Description

The herbalist certification & apprentice program focuses on providing in depth training to those who wish to use their knowledge as a Community Practitioner or the home herbalist who wants to add additional knowledge to their herbal plethora. The Herbalist Certification Program provides students with a wide array of herbal & alternative solutions to many common health challenges. Students will learn about wellness for the mind, body and spirit.

Expectations and Goals

- Students will receive instruction through lectures and demonstrations.
- Students will read from the selected texts, view videos, and participate in discussions.
- Students will fulfill homework assignments as written documents.
- Students will be required to begin and maintain a plant identification logbook
- Students will demonstrate understanding of and abilities in the practical application of acquired knowledge through execution and performance.
- Students are encouraged to attend (1) Herbal Retreat per year TBA / fee is not included in tuition cost will vary depending on retreat location
- Students are encouraged to assist in NCB School of Herbalism & Holistic Health events, programs, projects, research & workshops as a part of the apprenticeship
- Students must contribute to the conversation, provide relevant information, and interact with other students in a respectful and supportive manner.

- Students must keep a journal throughout the course, and participate in the design, formulations, execution, methods, functions, and results.
- There will be additional hands-on assignments issued to students outside of our current curriculum to help orient you in the practice of herbal medicine.
- Students are required to make, study, and keep monthly plant logs. These will be turned in every (3) month
- **Classes will meet virtually (1) monthly on Sunday afternoons from 4-6 pm central standard time.**
